Comparator Information for consideration of a Standing Overview Group proposed by Strategic Scrutiny Committee 16 June

Governance

Recommendation to Executive:

Set up a Committee on biodiversity and climate change to oversee to development and adoption of climate and biodiversity monitoring targets and their implementation across the council, and ensure its polices and strategies align and are designed to meet these targets, and respond to the work of the IPCC and climate change committee, and this reports to the scrutiny committee and the public twice a year on progress.

Continue work with DCC on citizens' assembly to help address the most challenging aspects of carbon reductions.

An annual GHG. Monitoring report be published so the council and city partners can understand progress towards net zero.

Biodiversity

That specific measures are progressed to create biodiversity enhancement plan for the city - drawing on the <u>Devon Local Recovery Partnership</u> that can inform the Local Plan and future investment in nature in Exeter

Climate

Projections of carbon emissions that will arise from Liveable Exeter and also the new local plan be modelled in detail.

Chief Executive & Growth Director

In relation to Net Zero there are two distinct areas of work Net Zero for the city council, and Net Zero for the City of Exeter. It helps to keep them separate.

The focus should primarily be on the Council's own Greenhouse Gas Emissions and it makes sense to leave this area until Members have had sight of the report.

In relation to the **city of Exeter**, there is limited officer capacity to support work, therefore Members should focus on areas already identified in the report to Executive on 5 July.

Two areas in particular would benefit for a considered and in depth review. I would therefore strongly urge over the next 12 months that this be the focus:

- 1. Biodiversity and carbon sequestration
- 2. Green construction and the supply chain.

<u>Biodiversity and carbon sequestration</u> In relation to the first scope, I would suggest members hear from four people/bodies:

- a. The Earl of Devon, Charles Courtney, Partner with Michelmores and owner of Powderham Castle on the role of coastal land management in terms of carbon sequestration and biodiversity
- b. Philip Letts, Devon Sculpture Park, small scale rewilding in action
- c. Tim Jones, The North Devon Biosphere and the contribution to carbon sequestration. Large scale land management.
- d. Rich Stockdale, MD Oxygen Conservation, carbon sequestration in action, and carbon pricing.

Climate

Refer all the transport targets to the Transport Working Group to consider the implications of 'Continuing the exponential growth in electric vehicles ownership' on air pollution and congestion and draw up policy options measures to incorporate into the Exeter Transport plan that accelerate the Council's goals to reduce car dependency and increase walking and cycling

Climate

- Use the funds previously agreed by Council to develop a business case for a retrofit company to work across the Council, Housing associations, and privately owned property, and develop partnerships to improve the supply chain.
- To extend the work begun on Council house retrofit to achieve BEPC all properties.
- To update the heat network studies focus on heat for water only and ensure houses are built to passivhouse standards (i.e. not requiring external heat sources). Adopt a commitment to reducing incineration - i.e. fossil fuels and a conversion to renewal heat generation, and the prioritisation of existing homes and bis prioritised - new ones should not need it.

Green construction and the supply chain

The purpose to gain an understanding of schemes in action within Devon, are there lessons that need to be learned, is there an accepted price for carbon that should be built into the development system?

Are there examples from other planning authorities that would be helpful to Exeter?

Members should consider whether they should make an inspection to the sites to see for themselves work in action.

In relation to green construction, hear from Mike Blakeley on the work of Exeter College in bringing together the construction sector in understanding the pipeline and technical challenges to supporting the retrofit programme. Hear from companies on the green construction group, such as Taylor Lewis Consider calling as witnesses the CEOs of the registered providers and the HRA on their investment programme in retrofit and their pipeline for the city. To gain an understanding from them of the constraints and barriers to action.

Climate

That the council adopt a 70% recycling target rate by 2025.

Climate

That the relevant waterways are included in the scope of the report and the city's net zero and biodiversity responsibilities. The city council is the port authority for the Exeter Ship Canal, and the Exe from the Mill on the Exe to one mile out to sea at Exmouth.
