## Introduction

Across the country, councils continue to face real financial pressure. In Exeter, our Labour led council has addressed this by prioritising key services, making careful decisions, listening to residents, and focusing on what matters most to our communities.

This year we have again set a balanced budget that allows us to deliver on our priorities, while keeping council tax among the lowest in the country. The city council's share remains just £191.31 for a Band D property, only a small part of the overall bill.

As a Labour administration, we have made clear choices to protect services, support residents and invest in Exeter's future. The new Renters' Rights Act is now in force, and we will ensure it is delivered locally, giving over 33,000 Exeter renters stronger rights and protections.

After years of difficult decisions, we are now in a strong position. We are not cutting services, and we are continuing to invest in the things that make Exeter a great place to live.

Independent research confirms that Exeter remains a city people are proud to call home, with high levels of satisfaction and trust in the council above the national average.

Our priorities remain clear:

- Supporting residents through the cost of living
- Leading on climate action
- Building more council homes
- Protecting green spaces
- Investing in culture and leisure
- Running a stable, well led council

## Our 2024 Pledges

We set out clear priorities for Exeter in 2024. Against a wide range of challenges, we committed to deliver across four key areas.

---

### Exeter's People

As a Labour led council, we committed to supporting residents and community groups, sustaining cultural and leisure programmes to improve health, wellbeing and enrichment, and increasing safety across the city.

- Support residents through the cost of living with targeted help and advice
- Improve community safety and reduce anti-social behaviour
- Invest in health, wellbeing, culture and leisure services

### Exeter's Environment

We committed to working with residents and key partners to reduce carbon emissions, protect and maintain our parks and open spaces, and increase biodiversity.

Despite reduced funding and rising costs, we committed to maintaining a strong and resilient council, supporting businesses and revitalising the city centre.

- St Sidwell's Point is a highly popular, leisure centre, competing with leading leisure centres nationally
- Continuing the Wellbeing Exeter programme
- With local and national partners Investing in major upgrades at King George V Playing Fields
- Delivering the Wonford Community Wellbeing Hub
- Providing targeted cost of living support
- Continuing investment in leisure services and health programmes

- Delivering further retrofit programmes to council homes
- Undertaking work to achieve Nature Towns and Cities accreditation
